- Michigan has the highest concentration of industrial designers in the nation, surpassing Ohio, Illinois, Texas, New York and California.¹
- Over the last eight years, nine Michigan cities have ranked on the list of top-10 metropolitan areas in the U.S. with the highest concentrations of industrial designers, and five of those cities are in Southwest and West Michigan.¹
- Southwest Michigan has its own creative community called <u>MIX</u> that brings together 1,200 innovators annually.

- Michigan Ranks in the top 10 states for U.S. design patents granted per capita.¹
- Students at <u>Western Michigan University's Richmond Institute for Design + Innovation</u> complete more than 125 credit hours over four years of hands-on industrial design education in 28,000 square feet of dynamic, open and collaborative workspace.
- Kalamazoo's 19-percent income growth over the past 11 years is the best in the state, and the city ranks among Michigan's top three fastest growing places.
